2009-2010 Player Registration Information

*** ALL NEW REGISTRATION PROCEDURES FOR 2009-2010 SEASON ***

GYBA has teamed with HB Sports Management Services and created a new website for online registration and payment for the upcoming season. **ALL** Phoenix players and coaches will register using this system which can be accessed from a link on the GYBA website.

From www.guelphbasketball.com

click on **JOIN PHOENIX REP**

and then on **REGISTER A PHOENIX PLAYER**

The registration is family based, so all parents and their contact information can be included in the profile. After you have added parent(s) and player(s), keep following the on-screen instructions until you confirm the registration. You will receive an email that confirms the details you have entered. You **DO NOT** pay anything at this point.

Once all players have entered their registration information, your son/daughter will be placed on a team and an invoice will be emailed to you. There may be a one to two week time lapse before the invoice arrives as we negotiate the new system.

The invoice will include instructions on how to pay online by credit card or by cheque by mail. Registration fees for the 2009-2010 season have been reduced to \$375.00 for all players. All Phoenix players will also be required to pay a recoverable \$150.00 fundraising fee. Payment is due as soon as you receive the invoice.

If your son/daughter is 13 or younger, they can indicate during the registration process that they would like to be considered as a Ball Boy / Ball Girl at one of the Gryphon Home Games. If this applies to you and you check YES, you will be contacted by email or phone with more details. Priority will be given to those who register before the Parents/Coaches Meeting on October 17.
